<b>a.</b>	Election of Officers	By acclamation, all officers have been reelected to their position.
<b>b.</b>	Spring Treatment/Jason Ziemer	<p>The DNR has approved off shore treatment of 10 acres. Grants have been reduced this year due to the higher volume of requests. SLIA will be submitting a grant request in the amount of \$1500, the maximum available, to help defray costs of off-shore treatment.</p> <p>Lake Management has provided some options for targeting Eurasian watermilfoil and/or curlyleaf. The Board is pursuing treatment of both. Jason will be presenting these options to the DNR, who will have the final say in what we may treat along with the targeted areas. The goal is that once the ice is free, a point intercept will be completed. It is the goal to have everything ready in preparation of optimum treatment timing.</p> <p>Motion was made and seconded to approve up to \$3030 for the spring off-shore lake treatment. Final amount to be determined based on DNR recommendation of treatment, location and depth. All ayes. Motion approved.</p> <p>Treatment of algae was discussed, specifically the use of Alum versus Copper Sulfate. John explained the VBWD thoughts on Alum. While it is often an excellent treatment for algae, this chemical needs to spread across the bottom of the lake and create a type of film in order for it to be effective. However, due to the shallowness of Silver Lake, they determined the chemical would be disrupted, not allowing itself to create the film and therefore be ineffective. Copper Sulfate appears to be the best option for Silver Lake for the treatment of algae. This will be discussed at the June meeting as timing of this treatment is often mid-summer.</p>
<b>c.</b>	Annual picnic/cleanup	This year's annual cleanup/picnic will once again be held on Earth Day, Saturday, April 20 in conjunction with the Neighborhood Watch group. Sherry Long has agreed to take the lead on this event. Joyce will create an information flyer to send out. All members and friends are encouraged to show up and assist - whether for one hour or all morning. Every bit helps. This clean up goes a long way in bringing community spirit and lake pride to Silver Lake. Please consider participating – it's also a great way to get kids involved.
